Auction in May

Casting for Recovery: Robin Healy and Mary Ann Dozer from The Stonefly Maidens are very active in the national "Casting for Recovery." They will give a short presentation at this month's meeting to promote a fly casting clinic being held in conjunction with "Reel Recovery." "Casting for Recovery" is for victims of female breast cancer and "Reel Recovery" is for male cancer victims.

The casting clinic will be held on Saturday, April 25th at Blue Lake Regional Park, Portland, Oregon. For more information you can contact Mary Ann Dozer at cfrcastingclinic@stoneflymaidens.org. This is a major fundraiser for cancer victims and is supported by FFF. The cost is \$50 for one workshop, \$75 for two workshops, or \$125 for a custom workshop and one other workshop. Workshops include:

- Beginning fly casting
- Beyond the basics: tune up your casting
- Accuracy
- Distance
- Single-hand spey casting
- Two-hand spey casting.

Our guests will provide more detail at this month's meeting and may even be looking for volunteers to support their efforts.

Fly of the Month: Mart's Snowshoe Caddis

Hook	Standard dry fly, round bend
Thread	GSP or other strong thread
Body	Superfine dubbing, color of your choice
Wings, Thorax, Legs	Hair from snowshoe hare's foot

History: The use of the hair from the foot of the snowshoe hare was first introduced in the 1980s. Fran Betters "Usual" was one of the first to use this "unusual" material. Why use it? It contains natural oils that make it hydrophobic and buoyant. The dense and curly hair holds lots of air bubbles and the guard hairs are stiff and translucent, giving it a very natural appearance. The buoyancy of this material is its greatest advantage. Its durability is also of great importance. If it becomes slimy after catching a few fish, simply rinse it off and dry it out by rubbing on your sleeve or by using a little desiccant. Silicone fly floatant should not be used.

Variations: Snowshoe hare's foot is also great for tying emergers. Ted Leeson and Jim Schollmeyer's book on **Tying Emergers** contains some great patterns.

How to Fish: Fish as a dry fly on the surface or in the surface film. Usually it is presented in a drag-free drift. However, a twitch or two might catch the interest of trout.

How to Tie:

1. Wrap the thread to the point above the barb.
2. Dub a thin and tight body, and then tie a small bunch of snowshoe hair "caddis style" on top of the hook as a wing. It should not be much longer than the hook.
3. A small spot of "Zap-A-Gap" will hold the wing in place.
4. Dub a small amount of underfur and tie around the thread holding the wing down.
5. Lift the bunch of hair over the eye of the hook and cut following the direction of the wing.
6. Whip finish. Apply head cement. Remember – a hare's foot can be a lucky charm. Go fishing.
